



School Uniform and Appearance

We expect all children in school to wear uniform. It supports us in promoting a sense of school identity and offers practical clothing for school life. From the parent's point of view, school uniform is inexpensive, durable and it reduces arguments about what to wear. Please support the school by ensuring that your child always wears uniform. Uniform Choices

White polo shirt

Black or dark grey school trousers

Black or grey smart shorts in warm weather

Jade green school sweatshirt with logo

Jade green school cardigan with logo

Black or grey socks

Black school shoes or plain black trainer shoes

Dark grey skirt, pinafore dress or shalwar kameez (these can be worn with black or grey leggings for modesty if required)

White or dark grey socks or black tights

Green Gingham school dress in warm weather (this can be worn with white leggings for modesty if required)

Plain head scarf – Jade green, black, white, grey.

Please note we do allow children to change into football boots/trainers if they are playing at break and/or lunch however we expect them to change back into uniform footwear prior to returning to class. Failure to do this may result in this privilege being withdrawn.

Jewellery

Children are permitted to wear a watch and stud earrings; these will need to be removed for P.E. If children arrive wearing other jewellery or jo jo bows in their hair they will be asked to remove it and we will return it to the child at the end of the day.

Appearance

As staff we have a clear dress code which we expect all staff to adhere to. We want our children to understand that appearance is important and as such they need to come to school with their hair in a neat and tidy fashion, long hair needs to be tied up for health and safety purposes.

We would request you support us in this by not allowing tram lines or other patterns shaved into their hair, not allowing dyed hair, make-up or false nails. We would ask children to wash their faces to remove make-up and will contact you with regard to any hairstyles or colour which we feel is inappropriate.
